THE COURT: Gentlemen, please identify 1 yourselves for the record. 2 MR. MILARDO: Attorney Milardo for the 3 plaintiff, High Street Associates. 4 MR. ZISK: William J. Zisk, pro se 5 defendant in this matter. 6 7 THE COURT: Okay. I have an objection to the plaintiff's motion for supplemental 8 judgment dated December 22, 1995. 9 What's the history of this matter? 10 MR. MILARDO: The history is, your Honor, 11 that it went to judgment in 1993. It was then 12 taken to Appellate Court, the Supreme Court of 13 the United States as well as our Supreme 14 Court. 15 Mr. Zisk has exhausted all avenues of 16 appeal. And, your Honor, this came to the 17 supplemental judgment stage because this was a 18 committee sale of -- through a partition 19 20 action. And my reading of the statute did not indicate the supplemental judgment was 21 required. But Barbara Link and I had a 22 discussion and I believe the Court -- some 23 individual in the Court felt that it was the 24

best thing to do because money was still being

held in the Court's hands for Mr. Zisk, which 1 was his ownership of the property. 2 So we filed a supplemental judgment in 3 That was approved by your Honor, I December. 4 believe, in March or February. And then 5 Mr. Zisk filed these motions. 6 Your Honor just dismissed a motion to 7 reopen and vacate the entire judgment. Which 8 was wisely done, I might add. 9 So really what we are here today on, as 10 far as I know, is the objection to the 11 supplemental judgment. 12 THE COURT: Well, the supplemental 13 judgment was entered by the Court on 14 15 January 17th. So why are we here, Mr. Zisk? 16 MR. ZISK: I guess, your Honor, it's that 17 I've been having -- see the distance of the 18 3,000 miles. See, I'm a resident of 19 California. And I had been having difficulty 20 following this matter with the delays and the 21 Court calendars and the actions that have been 22 taken in this matter. 23 And I have been notified that the -- my 24 25 objections which were submitted on

January 11th of this year are just now being 1 heard before the Court. And that's why I 2 travelled from California here to argue the 3 objections as they are printed on the 4 calendar. 5 THE COURT: Well, the only thing that I 6 have really before me is a motion to argue --7 or reargue defendant's motion to reopen and 8 vacate judgment sale. And that motion is 9 denied. 10 Now, since the motion for supplemental 11 judgment was granted by the Court on 12 January 17th, obviously any objections are 13 also overruled. I would submit they must have 14 been in the file at the time, January 12th. 15 Perhaps not. 16 17 That judgment -- that supplemental 18 judgment has already entered. And an appeal was taken? 19 MR. MILARDO: Not to --20 MR. ZISK: -- No. 21 MR. MILARDO: Not to the supplemental 22 23 judgment, your Honor; to the original judgment. 24 25 In fact, the sale was stayed until after

all appeals were exhausted including the United States Supreme Court, which was denied.

If I may, your Honor, while Mr. Zisk is here and so that is not a wasted trip, because I mentioned that to him when I called him when the motion for supplemental judgment was calendared -- we had a discussion on the phone. I said this is to allow you to pick up your check from the Clerk. As long as he's here, he can pick up his \$40,000 from the Clerk at this point.

I would make that suggestion through your Honor to him just as being friendly because he is under the impression that somehow by not picking up that check, is going to stay all these decisions or not allow them to take place. And they have taken place, your Honor.

THE COURT: Mr. Zisk?

MR. ZISK: Yes, your Honor. I would appreciate if the Court would hear me on this matter of my objection.

THE COURT: I've already made the decision, sir. So why should I go back and revisit? I'm not going to allow you to go

back and revisit -- and reargue this. 1 MR. ZISK: I guess I'm just having 2 extreme difficulty following this, your Honor. 3 THE COURT: I don't think you're having 4 that much difficulty. You've gone all the way 5 up to the Supreme Court --6 MR. MILARDO: -- On his own, he did a 7 8 good job. THE COURT: So I think you probably know 9 your way around, Mr. Zisk. 10 But I'm not going to spend more time on 11 this. Frankly, the judgment has been 12 entered. You have your appellate procedures 13 with which you are well acquainted. 14 MR. ZISK: Am I misunderstanding the --15 that my objections were placed on the calendar 16 17 for today? THE COURT: I don't take care of placing 18 them on the calendar. You do that. And we 19 have a procedure pursuant to Rule 211 since 20 October 1 of 1995. If you follow that, it 21 gets placed on the calendar. 22 MR. ZISK: Well, the order stated that if 23 24 I did not show up at this hearing, I would be 25 waiving that. It's been very expense and very

time consuming --1 THE COURT: -- I appreciate that. 2 MR. ZISK: I think this is pretty 3 ridiculous. And I'm here and I'm ready to 4 argue my objection like it was noted on the 5 6 calendar. THE COURT: I've already entered the 7 judgment. I don't care to hear your objection 8 at this point. 9 Judgment was entered and you could have 10 been present when that was done on 11 January 17th. That's when you should have 12 been here. Okay? You have to take an appeal 13 if you wish to do that. 14 MR. MILARDO: Thank you, your Honor. 15 16 17 (Whereupon this hearing concluded.) 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
